Pre-Entry (by 4/11/26) Horse Stall Fee: \$225/per stall -

Early arrival: Arrivals prior to 4/29/26 will incur \$75.00 per stall if available; Arrivals prior to 4/28/26 will incur \$100.00 per stall fee if available.

Layovers on 5/4/26 will incur \$75.00 per stall fee if available; Layovers after 5/5/26 will incur a \$100.00 per stall fee if available.

Horse move in date: 4/29/26 after 9:00 AM **Horse move out date:** 5/4/26 before 9:00 AM

Shavings: Orders placed after 2:00 PM will be delivered NEXT DAY.

NO OUTSIDE SHAVINGS PERMITTED.

Any off-site shavings will result in an additional \$25 clean up fee per stall.

All shavings must be ordered directly through WEC. QR codes are posted throughout the barns for easy ordering. Extravaganza will appear in the dropdown menu approximately one week prior to the start of the event.

A one-time \$50 clean up fee per stall and/or tack room will be incurred for any personal belongings left behind and/or trash.

Returned Check or Declined Credit Card Fee: \$100

If a returned check or declined credit card charge is not made good within 2 weeks after notification, PFHA will be immediately notified of non-compliance

Class Scratches: 50% refund if done the day before the class with Vet Certificate only. Scratches done on the same day as class will be non-refundable. Horses will not be able to compete once a Vet Certificate is received. Refunds will be issued within 30 days from the last day of the show.

****Stall fees are non- refundable. NO EXCEPTIONS!**

Stalls may only be transferred from one owner to another if all stalls are sold out. Upon receipt & approval of transfer request form (available at show office), person receiving stall will be charged the full stall fee & person transferring stall will receive a refund minus a \$50 handling fee.

ALL entries must include:

- Completed PFHA entry form (2 pages) with all required signatures
- Negative Coggins within 1 year
- Health declaration in State-Signed by Vet confirming that the horse has not experienced a fever exceeding 101.5 degrees or any disease in the 72 hours leading up to its arrival. Additionally, the horse must not have been exposed to or treated for an unexplained fever in the past 28 days and should have tested negative for any disease at least 30 days prior to its arrival. If the horse has tested positive within the last six months for any infectious diseases, this information should also be disclosed.
- Vaccination Record showing proof of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus vaccinations must be within 6 months prior to entering the competition grounds
- Out-of-state horses must present 30-day health certificate
- Copy of Horse registration
- **Copy of current PFHA membership cards for all riders, trainers and owners**
All owners, riders, trainers and coaches must be up to date with their Safe Sport training.
- **Form of payment-emailed entries must include signed credit card authorization form**
- **Mailed entries must include check made payable to: Ocala PFHA or signed credit card authorization form**
- **4% processing fee is added to all credit card transactions**

INSPECTIONS: Before entering the arena, all Exhibitors will be asked to go through a check-in area, and their horses will be inspected by the Inspection Farrier, Inspection Vet and Show Steward. All exhibitors will come with their horse tacked up but with bit in hand for Steward inspection. Only the bit that is inspected will be allowed in the holding area. Once in the holding area, if bit needs to be changed, the Exhibitor and horse must go back through the inspection area, if time permits. First, second- and third- class placements will have their bit checked by Steward at the line-up. NO SPURS PERMITTED IN HOLDING AREA. Horse tack is to be competition ready for the class showing. No training equipment of any kind will be allowed in the holding area, this includes additional bits, draw reins, strings etc. Bags/pails will be inspected. The Inspection Farrier will be checking for lameness and the legality of shoes. Trainer, Owner or Exhibitor may assist in lifting feet. Any horse refusing to have all four hooves inspected will NOT be allowed to compete. NO EXCEPTIONS! Exhibitors shall be familiar with the rules prohibiting soreing as per Paso Fino Horse Association rules, Chapter two, IV, Paragraph E; and with rules concerning shoeing as per Paso Fino Horse Association rules, Chapter two, IV, Paragraph C.

Any Exhibitor that fails or refuses the post-class bit inspection will be disqualified from the class and their placement will be forfeited.

CALL FOR CLASSES: The public-address system is a courtesy. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to have his or her horse at the gate at the start of any class. Every effort is made to maintain a working public address system, but Show Management is not liable for technical problems with the system that may occur. No refund will be made, schedule changed, or protests upheld on the basis of a PA failure. Exhibitors will be expected to enter the ring in a timely manner per USEF Rule PF-102 6.b which says "When horses are competing collectively, if horses do not enter in the in-gate ready to participate, after the in-gate is open, within two minutes, a warning is issued, and horses are given two minutes before the gate is closed and judging commences, or the class is canceled. "

AWARDS: Ribbons will be awarded to the 1st- 6th place in the class.

Extravaganza Championship Classes: Champions will receive flower blanket and crystal plaque. Reserve Champion through 4th placement will receive sash ribbons.

ENTRIES: Show Management reserves the right to decline any entry and return any entry fee before or during the show without liability for further compensation. Exhibitors are cautioned to be aware of and to abide by restrictions concerning exhibiting horses before judges as provided in USEF Chapter 8. Article 804 and PFHA Rules, Chapter Five, IX, General Conflict of Interest Rules Governing Showing under Judges.

PARKING: Horse trailer parking is NOT permitted in the barn area. Horse trailers MUST be parked in designated trailer parking areas. No trailers can be parked in grass areas behind Barns L, M, N, O, P and Q.

ONLY golf carts will be permitted in the area between the barns and main arena 5.

NO EXCEPTIONS!

DISCIPLINE: Exhibitors are hereby notified that the Ocala PFHA Board of Directors will strictly enforce and actively support all PFHA rules regarding sportsmanship, conduct & courtesy at all PFHA recognized shows and events. This includes but is not limited to rules that govern owners, exhibitors, agents, trainers, managers, riders, drivers, handlers, competition officials, competition employees and members of the families of the above, individual members of PFHA or any person who acts in a manner in violation of the Rules or deemed prejudicial to its best interests.

Any PFHA violation committed will be subject to PFHA penalties.

Exhibitors are notified that any act of discourtesy or disobedience to the judges, officials or show staff, on the part of the owner, manager, rider, or groom shall disqualify the horse, and the owner shall forfeit his entry fee, other fees and may be asked to leave showgrounds.

MOTORIZED VEHICLE STATEMENT: Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above-described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed

"Unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

DOGS ON COMPETITION GROUNDS: Dogs must always be on a leash while on showgrounds.

PRESS/MEDIA CREDENTIALS: Press passes will be issued at the sole discretion of Show Management. At the issuance of a press pass, press is expected to follow all event policies and procedures failure to do so will result in forfeiture of credentials. NO EXCEPTIONS!

EXHIBITOR PROBLEMS/SPECIAL REQUESTS: All non-emergency problems or special requests must be relayed through show management to ensure prompt attention.

AMERICANS WITH DISABILITIES ACT: It is important to Ocala PFHA that everyone involved in our shows and events has the best experience possible. If you have any needs or ADA accessibility issues which we could address in advance to make your experience better, please contact the show chair.

DAMAGE: World Equestrian Center holds individual owners and exhibitors responsible for damages incurred by them, or their agents, to barns or other property on the showgrounds and will bill them accordingly. Ocala PFHA, Extravaganza and/or Show Management will in no way be responsible for any loss/damage that may occur. It will be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the horse show, its management and WEC blameless for any loss or accident to his/her horse(s) or equipment that may occur from sickness, fire or otherwise. Ocala PFHA, Extravaganza and WEC will not be responsible for injuries sustained in any way to exhibitors, spectators, employees or any other interested parties.

**Exhibitors will be notified of any changes or additions to this Prize List as soon as possible via email blast and social media posts. **

CLASSIC FINO PROCEDURE: Exhibitors shall enter the ring to the right on the rail and circle the arena in a counterclockwise manner until instructed to reverse or halt. Horses must work both directions, reverse, halt and proceed in gait and traverse the sounding board when available. Breaking gait on reverses, stops or starts shall be penalized. A figure eight (8) may be requested to demonstrate flexibility, responsiveness and steadiness of gait, but diminishing circles are not allowed. Only inanimate objects may be used as "posts" for the figure eight as long as they do not present a danger to horse or rider. A solid, continuous surface allowing no more than one-half inch of space between the boards, ground level, hard surface sounding board forty-eight (48) feet or longer shall be used in this class to clearly exhibit the rhythmic consistency of the horse's cadence and impact when available. The performance of the horse on the sounding board shall not be given preference over the horse's work on the rail. During competition, while being judged, exhibitors are not allowed to turn on the sounding board. Backing of the horses may be requested. Judges may call for horses to work on the parallel at the Classic Fino as an optional test. Judges may call for horses to work in circles at the Classic Fino as an optional test. Judges may call for horses to perform a serpentine at the Classic Fino as an optional test.

PASO PERFORMANCE PROCEDURE: Exhibitors shall enter the ring to the right on the rail at a collected Paso Corto and circle the arena in a counterclockwise manner. The sequence of gaits shall be collected Paso Corto, collected Paso Largo to show the marked difference in speed, Collected Walk, reverse and repeat. While executing the Collected Walk, entries should space themselves to avoid bunching up and maintain their relative positions on the rail. In the collected Paso Corto and collected Paso Largo, entries shall maintain a position on the rail except to pass. A solid, continuous surface, allowing no more than a one-half inch of space between the boards, ground level, hard surface sounding board 48-feet or longer shall be used when available. However, the Judges may require horses to perform only the Paso Corto gait over the sounding board. Judges may call for a serpentine at a collected Paso Corto and/or a figure eight at a collected Paso Corto as requirements for a work off of horses in close competition. At a very minimum, a serpentine should consist of half circles with one-hundred eighty (180) degree turns.

PASO PLEASURE PROCEDURE: Exhibitors shall enter the ring to the right on the rail at a Paso Corto and circle the arena in a counterclockwise manner. The riders shall space themselves while executing the flat Walk so as to avoid bunching up and shall maintain their relative positions on the rail. In the Paso Corto and the Paso Largo, entries shall maintain a position on the rail except to pass. The sequence of gaits shall be Paso Corto, Paso Largo to demonstrate the marked difference in speed, flat Walk, reverse and repeat and traverse the sounding board when available. Each rider shall be asked to demonstrate the back from the line-up. In the back, the horse shall maintain proper head position, show evidence of a good mouth, back in a straight line and be readily responsive. At the Judge's discretion, riders may be asked to perform individually. The required test should show the submissive manners, willingness and quiet temperament. Some of the request may be as follows: 1. Dismount and remount from the left side, either in the lineup or along the rail, except in Youth classes. Rider's style of dismount and mount is not to be emphasized; rather, emphasis is placed on the horse's willingness to stand quietly. 2. Perform a serpentine at the Paso Corto gait. 3. Perform the Paso Corto gait over the sounding board. 4. Back on the board. 5. Back on the rail. Any combination of the above may be used for a work-off



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
